Subject: Rejoinder about news items “Games security papers stolen” and “Added security at Games office?”

Sir,

This refers to the captioned news items appeared in the newspaper The Asian Age, on 5-11-2009 and 6-11-2009 respectively. In the news items, it is claimed that the **documents related to Commonwealth Games security plans were “stolen” on Wednesday** which is factually incorrect and misleading.

It is clarified that on 3-11-2009 Shri Rahul Singh, Admin Assistant (Security), Commonwealth Games Organising Committee had lodged a report at P.S. Cannaught Place that a head unit (Mouth) of stereo make- Kenwood and papers related to the car were found missing from his car parked at the basement NDMC Commonwealth Games Building, Jai Singh Road. A case under section 380 IPC vide FIR No. 228, dated 3-11-2009 has accordingly been registered. Investigation is in progress.

In view of the above facts and circumstances, it is clear that there was no theft of any security related or official documents whatsoever as reported in the news item. The reporter seems to have filed the report on the basis of unverified facts without taking pains to verify about the same from authorized Delhi Police sources.

It is therefore, requested that the correct facts of the matter may please be published with the same prominence for the reader of your esteemed news paper who might have been misled by reading the incorrect contents of the news item.
